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Introduction

Faithful Bloggers is a community for Christian bloggers. Our purpose is to provide a common ground where we can encourage one another to use our blogs for the glory of God. Why was Faithful Bloggers started?

As blogging continues to grow in popularity amongst women, a wonderful benefit to this “hobby” has arisen. The ability to meet new friends and form relationships is easier than ever. For those who are in rural areas or are housebound in some way, meeting someone is as easy as turning on your computer and relaying your thoughts. For Christians a challenge becomes apparent. The Project

Faithful Bloggers issued a group writing challenge and 24 Christian bloggers stepped up and met the challenge.

The Challenge

The topic for the second Faithful Blogger’s Group Writing Project was about Romans Road. Each blogger selected a verse and wrote a post explaining what that verse means to them. It could be as long or as short as they wanted. It could be a personal testimony, a devotional, or Bible study in nature. The only rule was that it had to be about a verse from Romans Road.

Romans Road

Romans 3: 23, *“For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;”*

Romans 3:10-18, *“As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one: There is none that understandeth, there is none that seeketh after God. They are all gone out of the way, they are together become unprofitable; there is none that doeth good, no, not one. Their throat [is] an open sepulchre; with their tongues they have used deceit; the poison of asps [is] under their lips: Whose mouth [is] full of cursing and bitterness: Their feet [are] swift to shed blood: Destruction and misery [are] in their ways: And the way of peace have they not known: There is no fear of God before their eyes”*

Romans 6:23, *“For the wages of sin [is] death; but the gift of God [is] eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.”*

Romans 5:8, *“But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.”*

Romans 10:9, *“That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.”*

Romans 10:13, *“For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.”*

Romans 5:1, *“Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:”*

Romans 8:1, *“[There is] therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.”*

Romans 8:38-39, *“For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”*

Romans 3:23

I think **SIN** is a major stumbling block to getting saved. After all, if you don't believe you're a sinner, why would you need a Savior?

You may think that certainly all people realize they sin. But many people rationalize sin. They claim their intentions are pure. Or they may say they've never committed the really **BIG SINS** like murder or adultery.

But Jesus says in Matthew 5:27-28:

"You have heard that it was said, 'Do not commit adultery.' But I tell you that anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart."

The standard is extremely high!

God is holy. He is perfect. He cannot come into the presence of sin.

Consider this analogy. If you walked into a smoke filled room and you never smoked, you would immediately be aware of the odor. But if you were a smoker and you walked into that same room, you may not even be aware of the smell.

That's like us rationalizing sin. We tend to adjust to our own standard instead of God's standard of perfection.



We are born into this world with a sin nature. You can thank Adam and Eve for that.

Since God cannot be in the presence of sin, what can we do?

- We can't earn holiness.
- We can't do acts of penance to secure us a place in heaven.

The only way to God the Father is **...through Jesus His Son.**

That is the most wonderful gift from a loving God. He knew we were doomed because of sin. But He sent Jesus to be fully human and fully Divine. He lived a perfect life without sin and died on the cross to pay the penalty for our sins. He was punished for you and me.

Because He was the only One who could live that perfect life, He offers us a way to come to the Father. By receiving His gift of life, we can be set free from the penalty of our sins.

But there is one thing you must do to be saved.



You must **receive this free gift** into your heart.

Admit that you're a sinner and you can't save yourself. Simply invite Jesus into your heart.

You try so hard to teach your children right from wrong. You take them to church to ensure they know what the Bible says, and yet, as they turn into teenagers, they begin to rebel. They do things that they know are not right such as sneaking out, drinking, smoking and so on. "Why?" you ask them. The response: "because everyone else is doing it. I just want them to like me." Frustrating, right?

Peer pressure is extremely difficult to handle as a teenager. Adults have a hard time telling their friends no, but for teenagers, it is worse. So much is changing with them and that is awkward. The only thing they want is to be accepted. Unfortunately, that means they do things they know are wrong.

Romans 3:10-18

These are very serious charges. The verdict: guilty. Who is the guilty party? All of mankind. Who indicts us? God Himself

Man is corrupt. You can deny if you want. It doesn't matter. The evidence is all around us. Don't believe me? Turn on the news. Look at your neighbors. Look at your family. Take an honest look at yourself! We are a sin stained people.

As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one:

The Word of God tells us that only Jesus Christ, who is also God, is good. There has never been nor will there ever be a perfect person other than Jesus Christ. It's not possible. As humans we have a sin nature, and that nature will prevent us from ever being the good people we tell ourselves that we are. Their feet are swift to shed blood:

People are often quick to do evil and slow to do what is right. Revenge. Murder. People are spiteful and hateful by nature. Tit for tat. An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth. If you have ever hated someone then you have held murder in your heart. Just the thought of murder is murder to God. People are generally at the ready to do wrong. Romans 6:23

Others may mock and say "God is going to strike you down if you sin" as if it is some big joke. And yet others may say "I'll deal with it when the time comes. I have plenty of time." They're not thinking of death because they are too busy living; and they're running out of time.

The death this verse is referring to isn't a death of the body. It isn't even a death of the mind. It is the death of the soul. Eternal death. Condemnation. Forever lasting. The heaviest of consequences. No joking matter. And you won't have a chance to deal with it when the time comes.

God is preparing a place in His Kingdom for all those who believe and accept Him— this is eternal life. He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to be tortured and condemned— to die in our places— for the very sins we commit on a daily basis. Romans 5:8

*Imagine you are in a courtroom, standing before a judge. You have committed horrible crimes – punishable by death. However, the judge declares that it is possible for you to go free and the record of your offenses erased forever, **if** someone will die in your place.*

You look around the room, but no one volunteers. You resign yourself to the fact that you must die. Then, a man steps forward – the judge's son. "I'll die for her," he says, and the judge willingly offers his son, his only son, in your place. You cannot believe this gift has been granted to you as you walk out of the courtroom – free and forgiven.

You may think this is an unbelievable story. No innocent man would willingly die for another innocent person, much less a guilty one. And no father would offer his only son as a sacrifice. However, those of us who know Christ as our Savior received such a gift. We were guilty – just like the person in the story. Our sins and transgressions were worthy of death, but God showed us love and mercy by sending his son, Jesus Christ, to die in our place. The Lamb of God, innocent and without sin, took upon himself the sins of the world. Over two-thousand years ago, He paid the ultimate price by giving his life upon the cross in order that we might live free. His sacrifice is the highest form of love.

Do you ever think about how you can demonstrate love to others? To your family, your friends, your neighbors, your co-worker, etc? You can demonstrate love to your family by doing something special for them, something they will remember and leave a lasting impression. To your friends, by making them a homemade meal when they are ill. Mowing the lawn for your neighbor who is a single mom. To your co-worker, by buying them their favorite coffee. To demonstrate love just because.

The word demonstrate means to extend, to reach, to come.

Romans 5:8 says: *But God demonstrates, His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.*

I love this verse for so many reasons. But one of the reasons I really like it so much and have it after my signature when closing in an e-mail is because it reminds me of what I was before Christ was in my life. It reminds me that it was Him who loved me first, not because of what I have done, but because of what He did. Romans 10:9

*"Romans 10:9 and 10
I believe it once and then
I've got a life that will never end
I've got Christ in me
Whoopee!"*

As a kid I remember learning this song in one of my Bible study lessons. The depth and meaning flew over my head and I just loved Jesus with the innocent heart of a child, which desolved as that heart became the heart of an adult filled with its deceits and lies. I strayed far away from Christ, and then one day met and married a man who represented Christ in the most incredible way and I truly came to understand what it meant to be a Christian. As a result, Romans 10:9 came to have a completely new meaning.

"because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." ESV

At a quick skim this verse seems rather simple and something anyone can do, then you break it down and realize the life changing quality involved in this one simple sentence. I can only explain the meaning through God's Word.

The definition of confess in the original Koine Greek of the New Testament meant "to declare openly by way of speaking out freely, such confession being the deep conviction of facts." (*Vine's Expository Dictionary*). Mouth, "since thoughts of a man's soul find verbal utterance by his mouth the "heart" or "soul" and mouth are distinguished." ([Blue Letter Bible](#)).

Confessing with our mouth is then something that can only truly happen when we hold a deep conviction about Christ. But what is that deep conviction? That Jesus is Lord.

When you look at the definition of Lord it begins to become more clear, "the title 'Lord,' as given to the Savior, in its full significance rests upon the resurrection, and is realized only in the Holy Spirit." (*Vine's Expository Dictionary*) [1Cor12:3](#) discusses this. A second definition is, "he to whom a person or thing belongs, about which he has power of deciding; master, lord." ([Blue Letter Bible](#)).

Looking at the Greek definition of Lord really makes you understand the gravity and significance of believing that Jesus truly is our Lord. It can't be something said in passing, it has to be a true confession because it's admitting, realizing, and accepting that when Jesus rose from the dead He became our Lord and Master. We belong to Him because of the fact that He died for our sins. He paid the price of living yours and my sinful life. We owe everything to Him, and there is nothing we can claim for ourselves.

This is why the second part of this verse is so important. Anyone can "confess," but believing what they're saying is a whole different matter.

The definition of believe used in the New Testament in this verse speaks, "of the conviction and trust to which a man is impelled by a certain inner and higher prerogative and law of soul. To trust in Jesus or God as able to aid either in obtaining or in doing something: saving faith." ([Blue Letter Bible](#)).

I find it interesting that the essence of believing is described as being in the heart. The way it was viewed was the chief organ of physical life. ([Lev 17:11](#))

*"It occupies the most important place in the human system. By an easy transition the word came to stand for man's entire mental and moral activity, both the rational and the emotional elements. In other words, the heart is used figuratively for the hidden springs of the personal life. The Bible describes human depravity as in the 'heart', because sin is a principle which has its seat in the center of man's inward life, and then 'defiles' the whole circuit of his action, [Mat 15:19, 20](#). On the other hand, Scripture regards the heart as the sphere of Divine influence, [Rom 2:15](#); [Act 15:9](#) The heart, as lying deep within, contains 'the hidden man,' [1Pe 3:4](#), the real man. It represents the true character but conceals it' (J. Laidlaw, in *Hastings' Bible Dic.*)."* (Vine's Expository Dictionary)

I think that's such a beautiful picture that the organ that's central in our body, it transports blood throughout our arteries and veins, which delivers the much needed Oxygen to every part of our system, is the place where believing takes place. It's been seen as deceitful, lying, traitorous, but becomes renewed, pure, and cleansed by truly believing in Christ.

And the benefits are too many to count. Here's just the beginning of all the different ways we will be and are saved:

-The spiritual and eternal salvation granted immediately by God to those who believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, [Act 2:47](#).

-The present experiences of God's power to deliver from the bondage of sin, [Mat 1:21](#); [Rom 5:10](#); [1Cr 15:2](#); [Hbr 7:25](#); [Jam 1:21](#); [1Pe 3:21](#).

-The future deliverance of believers at the Second Coming of Christ for His saints, being deliverance from the wrath of God to be executed upon the ungodly at the close of this age and from eternal doom, [Rom 5:9](#).

-Inclusively for all the blessings bestowed by God on men in Christ, [Luk 19:10](#); [Jhn 10:9](#); [1Cr 10:33](#); [1Ti 1:15](#). (Summarized from *Vine's Expository Dictionary*. I only put the ones that apply to all believers inclusively).

The moment we are saved is a beautiful thing. The new believer clinging to Christ is incredible and something that only God can gift to us. Once that confession occurs it's truly life changing. We then follow and grow closer to Christ, which is uncomfortable because we're not of this world. Jesus died like He had been the one to live our sinful lives, and as a result is now the only mediator between us and the Father. Our lives literally depend on Him.

Romans 10:13

Romans 5:1

For many years, even after I became a Christian, I believed it was necessary to justify my past sinful behavior. I didn't understand what justification was at the time and felt the responsibility of my salvation was on me. I just didn't understand. I was determined to use religion to justify my sinful behavior and turned to religious perfection as proof of my justification and salvation. I was wrong. I spent years in a give up, try- hard cycle that kept me from true freedom and peace with God.

I learned from Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary that to justify means "to pronounce free from guilt or blame; to absolve". Having tried to justify my past sins, I tried to pronounce myself free and absolved of my own sins through my religious work. Of course this too, is a sin.

Essentially, by justifying my own behavior through religious perfection I was claiming myself sinless, but self-justified. The exhaustion and fear that resulted from my self-justified, I can do it myself attitude, kept me from peace and strangled me in exhaustion, fear, and anxiety, which caused panic attacks and more fear. Because I wrongly believed I was in charge of my own justification, my thoughts produced the fear of death. My religious behavior was heavy on working and giving the appearance of salvation, and light on face to face Jesus time in my bible or in prayer.

Discovering that justification for sins can also be hidden in the "I blame my parents" for who I am argument can keep a Christian trapped in self-justification. As a part of Generation X, that made coffee houses, finding them self, and parent blaming a spectator sport, I learned this argument because it was easier to blame my parents to justify the things I wanted to do in my life than to truly seek true forgiveness and justification through faith in Jesus Christ.

But, a Christian only experiences freedom from self-justification when they realize the burden of peace with God doesn't rely on them, but on Jesus Christ. You can't image the relief in my spirit when I was able to grasp true justification through faith. When I learned to put my faith in what He did on the cross, recognizing that He is the only road to the Father, I stopped working at living my life and started living to serve my King with my life.

I discovered two verses that changed my life.

* Because, "if we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."- I John 1: 8-9, NIV

* "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." -Romans 8:38, NIV

I feared mostly that God was going to separate himself from me because I wasn't sure if I could really trust Jesus to do the work that He promised He was going to do, and that is to save me and bring me into peace with God. When I stepped out of my role of playing God and justifying myself through religious, worldly behavior, and into the role of being a saved servant of Jesus Christ, I discovered peace for the first time.

Every where I read in the bible I looked for Jesus in the verse.

And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. -Phil. 4:7, NIV

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.- John 14: 27, NIV

I see now that fear and anxiety can creep back into my life when I spend little time in the bible daily reminding myself of Jesus' promise. It is a fearful thing to put your life in the hands of someone else.

On my Romans Road I am learning to trust Jesus by daily walking with Him, remembering, studying, and memorizing that "nothing will be able to separate [me] ... from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" -Romans 8:38, NIV [because I have been] "justified by faith, [and I] have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:" -Romans 5:1, NIV

These last several days I have been meditating on Romans 8:1. As a matter of fact these last couple of years I have been, so to speak, revisiting my salvation experience and looking at my own personal relationship with my Father in Heaven. It is more real to me than it ever has been and I am amazed at God's plan for our salvation—our reconciliation with Him. A true miracle. Romans 8:1 says:

There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus,^[a] who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit. NKJV

The words “no condemnation” in this verse speak to our eternal life. When we “believe in” and “confess” Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior we are no longer destined (condemned) to eternal hell. You may say, “That sounds a little strong.” Maybe, but it is the Truth. There is only one way to Heaven and that is by accepting Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. I still remember quite clearly, the time in my life, when I first came across this scripture in the Bible.

In this life, we will all face different forces to be reckoned with. Those forces take shape in a variety of forms such as daily trials, disease, and death. When we are in these circumstances we ask why God is allowing these things to happen to us. We can't wrap our heads around why bad things happen to good people. Often, instead of drawing closer to God we drift farther away because we are angry, sad, and confused about our present suffering. In Romans 8:38-39 the apostle Paul states, "*For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.*" Paul is telling us that suffering does not separate believers from Christ but it actually is meant for us to draw closer to His love.

Recently, I experienced first hand the power of God's love. My husband and I were expecting identical twin girls and were absolutely thrilled. As we happily attended baby showers, bought new clothes, and decorated the nursery we were filled each day with bliss. Every doctor appointment showed that the girls were growing and were developing on schedule. Around 27 weeks, I woke up with a sharp pain in my stomach. As the morning continued, the pain became more persistent so my husband rushed me to the hospital. Within minutes we discovered that I was fully dilated and I would have to undergo an emergency C-section. Throughout the surgery I was so scared and fearful for my babies. The girls were born weighing two pounds and were rushed to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). Later that day, we learned that both girls had to rely on a ventilator for their breathing and they were in a very critical state. Our physician told us that we faced a long road ahead of us that would be filled with many ups and downs. As time continued, the girls battled several infections that made me fear for their lives. Watching my little girls fight death, I felt hopeless and became very fearful for their lives. Over the course of our 81 days in the NICU, Satan used my fear of them dying to manipulate my mind.

In Romans 8:38, one of the first items that Paul states is that death shall not be able to separate us from the love of God. Instead of distancing ourselves from God's love when we are suffering, we should desperately cling to Him. When He is holding us in His arms, the power of the Holy Spirit gives us strength to fight death or any other trial that we are presently facing. This verse states that 'nor height, nor depth' shall separate us from the love of God. This shows that it is impossible for us to get beyond God's loving reach. His arms will always hold us tightly if we choose Him instead of asking why we are suffering. Bad things happen to good people so those believers in Christ can use their experience to glorify the name of God. When we turn to Christ in our darkest hours, the veil is removed from our eyes and we witness his uncontainable love for us. Psalm 18:22 beautifully says, *"But the LORD watches over those who fear him, those who rely on his unfailing love. He rescues them from death and keeps them alive in times of famine. We put our hope in the LORD. He is our help and our shield. In him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in his holy name. Let your unfailing love surround us, LORD, for our hope is in you alone."*

Friends, seek refuge in Christ during your times of suffering. His love for us is greater than anything else in this world because He gave us the ultimate sacrifice of Christ Jesus dying on the cross for our sins. God is love and we were created by Him to love Him. When we give ourselves to Christ, we know that His love will get us through anything that we face in this life.

Prayer: *God, please take away my fear of death. Please hold me in your arms so I can feel your love. I pray for the Holy Spirit to come inside of me and give me strength to fight this battle. Thank you for sacrificing your son for my sins. Thank you for being my help and my shield. I am putting my hope in you alone. In Jesus' name, Amen.*

We cannot be separated from God's love.

Children need to know that as a child of God He will never leave them. Use this lesson to help children understand salvation and the love of God.

“For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

Romans 8:38-39 (KJV)

The Love of God is HUGE. It is bigger than anything.

What are some big things?

God's love is bigger than any of those things. He loves us so much that even though we have done naughty things, God gave His Son Jesus to take away our sin.

What is sin?

The naughty things we do are sin. Moms, dads, boys, girls, and even grandpa and grandmas have sinned. Everybody, but God has sinned.

Have someone toss or roll a ball.

We can still see the ball. God loves us so much He throws our sin where we will not see it again. When we do naughty things and sin again, we can ask God to forgive us and He will throw them away.

Sometimes people who love us leave.

Does that make you sad?

After we ask God to take away our sin and believe in Him, He will always be with us. We cannot see God, but He is always there. God will NEVER leave us. There is not anything that can separate us from God's love.

Take a piece of duct tape, fold it over, and put the sticky sides together. Set it in the sun and make sure it is stuck together tightly.



Ask a child to try and peel the tape apart.

God's love is stronger than duct tape that is stuck together. We cannot be peeled away from God's love.

Read Romans 8:38-39.

"For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (KJV)

These verses mean that when we believe on God, He is with us now and when we die. He loves us and keeps us safe from things we see and the things we can't see.

Do you know what you are going to be doing years from now?

God knows what things are going to happen to you now and in the future and He will not leave you.

Where is the highest place you could go?

You cannot get away from God's love in the highest place or in the lowest place.
